Tell Them From Me Survey - A Department of Education Survey Tool for Schools

We have already surveyed our senior students. Now we would appreciate parents completing a survey about our school. Amongst other purposes, the results are used for reporting on the School Plan and in the Annual School Report.

The *Partners in Learning* **parent feedback survey** is part of the *Tell Them From Me* suite of surveys (student, teacher and parent surveys) on student engagement. It asks parents and carers questions about different factors that are known to impact on student wellbeing and engagement.

This survey will help our school understand parents' and carers' perspectives on their child's experience at school. These include: communication between parents/carers and staff, activities and practices at home and parent/carer views on the school's support of learning and behaviour. This valuable feedback will help our school make practical improvements.

The survey is conducted entirely online at home or on public computers. The survey will typically takes 15 minutes or less to complete and is completely confidential. The parent survey will be conducted from now until 4th October. Participating in the survey is entirely voluntary; however, your responses are very much appreciated.
